<p>ACCESS (<i>Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State</i>): Standards-based, criterion referenced English language proficiency test designed to measure English language learners' social and academic proficiency in English (1-4 hours)</p>	<p>ELL (EL student only)</p>	<p>Winter January 15-February 2</p>	<p>Kindergarten through Grade 8</p>
<p>Accelerated Reader: A computer managed reading program. This program is hosted in some elementary school buildings and helps to monitor the comprehension of books read independently by students.</p>	<p>Reading</p>	<p>Quizzes are taken as a book is completed independently by a student</p>	<p>Kindergarten through Grade 6</p>
<p>Curriculum GOLD/Early Learning Lab: An observational assessment tool which takes a snapshot of how a child is progressing in relation to 38 research-based objectives that include predictors of school success and are aligned with the Common Core State Standards, state early learning guidelines, and the Head Start Child Development and Early Learning Framework. DLM (Dynamic Learning Maps): The Dynamic Learning Maps Alternate Assessment System assesses what students with the most significant cognitive disabilities know and can do in English language arts (ELA), mathematics, and science. The DLM system provides accessibility by design and is guided by the core belief that all students should have access to challenging, grade-level content (75-150 minutes)

FitnessGram: A youth physical fitness assessment which assesses the five components of health-related fitness: Aerobic Capacity, Muscular Strength, Muscular Endurance, Flexibility, and Body Composition. (1-2 hours total)

Illinois Science Assessment: State-mandated based on the Illinois Learning Standards in science incorporating the Next Generation Science Standards. (1-2 hours)

KIDS (Kindergarten Individual Development Survey): State-mandated assessment which provides a picture of a child's developing strengths across multiple domains, including cognitive skills, language, social-emotional skills, approaches to learning and physical health. (1 hour per trimester)

Local Assessments: A series of comparable assessments which measure and monitor learning over 2 or more points in time; they are designed with the same form, content and level of complexity.

NWEA MAP (*Measure of Academic Progress*): An adaptive assessment used to measure a student's progress and academic growth; compares and predicts student achievement and growth over time via normative and growth information. (1-4 hours per administration)

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PARCC (*Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers*): State-mandated instrument which assesses students' current performance and points the way to what students need to learn to be ready for the next grade level and, by high school graduation, for college and/or a career. (total 10-11.5 hours)

STAR: Computer adaptive assessments which identifies skills and sub-skills students should know to be successful in reading and math.
